At Bridge Street Mission, Celebrate Recovery is our addiction support group curriculum. Each resident in the Sober Living Center participates, and our weekly group session is open to the public and includes a healthy meal.

Celebrate Recovery is a Christ-centered, 12-step recovery program for anyone struggling with hurt, pain or addiction of any kind. With this program, we offer a safe place for hurting men and women to find community and freedom from the destructive issues that can easily take control of a fragile life.

With Celebrate Recovery, we focus on the Biblical principles behind the commonly known 12 steps, and we integrate eight additional recovery principles from the Biblical Beatitudes.

Four members of our Celebrate Recovery team recently attended a large Celebrate Recovery training conference in Indiana and returned equipped and enthused to help anyone and everyone who struggles with addictive behaviors and their consequences.

FROM DESPAIR, TO elegration!

Kevin was a husband, owned a nice home, and was successful in the business world. Alcohol took it all away!

One day, some friends went looking and found him alone in his house with his dog. Kevin's wife had left him, and he had been drinking heavily. Stress from his work had taken a brutal toll on Kevin's life.

Thankfully, his friends brought him to Bridge Street Mission. "When I arrived here, I was spiritually bankrupt and had lost sense of my purpose in life," Kevin recalls. "In just a few days, it was clear that the entire staff was here to help with open hearts and no judgment."

Kevin explains that in addition to a faith-based and nurturing environment, the Mission provides the opportunity to learn a trade or to serve in our Outreach Center, preparing and serving food for dozens of hungry guests each day.

"By serving others, and in the daily Bible study and pastoral counseling, I found new hope," he says. "My sense of purpose arose. Every Thursday during Celebrate Recovery, we would break bread, sing praise to the Lord, then discuss the 12 steps of recovery and their Biblical comparisons."

"Celebrate Recovery reminded me that addiction is giving up everything for one thing, and recovery is giving up one thing for everything," Kevin says with a smile. "That insight and new sense of humility has stayed with me to this day."

Kevin was able to reconcile with his wife and return home after a short time at the Mission. He is committed to continue on his path to recovery with his newfound hope and sense of purpose.

At times, at Bridge Street Mission, we provide vital care to the chronically homeless. For many, however, we're there to help rescue them before they become homeless. Our wholistic care changes hurting people's lives in amazing ways... Praise be to God!
