# PREPARE MEN FOR WORK

Work usually plays a vital role in recovery. At Bridge Street Mission, we offer several vocational tracks to help each man take ownership of his own recovery.

When a resident in our Sober Living Center enters the transformational phase of our program, we offer him a scholarship for up to eight months. He will fully engage in our comprehensive curriculum and schedule, taking classes, receiving individual counseling and entering one of our vocational tracks. His options include:

- Culinary Arts
- Facility Management
- Welding
- Production/Assembly
- Retail

Addiction is an obstacle to employment. Many of the men who come to us for help do not have trouble finding work. Jobs are plentiful in the area. Employers are experiencing high turnover in their work force, finding it increasingly difficult to fill their shifts.

# Employment is a major part of a life journey.

However, when a man first enters the Sober Living Center at Bridge Street Mission, we actually discourage him from going out to get a job until we work through the issues that have been sidetracking him.

Part of the curriculum for our transformational program is Jobs for Life. This class goes beyond finding a job and focuses on the dignity of work and helps our residents determine what they were created to do.

Between this foundational class and our five Vocational Tracks (see cover story), we hope to prepare men to be successful when they return to work. In the meantime, our guys stay active in their classwork and chores, and even serve the community.

Please join us for **Denim and Diamonds** (Feb. 23, 2023) when we will celebrate the next group

of men who will graduate and return to full employment. We will continue to support them by providing transportation for the first six months and helping them set up a budget to live on.

We believe God created everyone to work. He designed all of us with gifts and talents to subdue and steward the earth through work. We find our purpose, meet our economic needs, and worship God through our work. (Jobs for Life)

But men who struggle with addiction often cannot keep a job due to poor attendance, attitudes and performance directly associated with their alcohol or drug addiction.

Our vocational training gives residents a valuable opportunity to learn the skills of employment, in a supportive environment that recognizes each unique recovery journey.

# PREPARE MEN FOR WORK

Culinary Arts is taught by our foodservice manager, Bonnie Galloway, and we use our Outreach Center as the learning lab. Three volunteers rotate as instructors in the Facility Management track as they teach the residents while caring for our facilities. A former resident taught the Welding track at an offsite location. We collaborate with Northern Valley Industries and Goodwill for the Production/ Assembly and Retail tracks.

Each of these tracks is immensely important for every man to begin the process of healing and recovery. We help him to explore the gifts and talents he has been given and how to use them to find and advance in a meaningful job. He will develop both hard and soft skills to prepare for employment.

One resident in the Welding track shared how the program helped him get a job and learn

useful new skills. "It gave me a foot in the door to a workplace," he says. A resident in Culinary Arts says that it helped him to work better with other people. "I went from being isolated in my room to working with people and serving them."
